The Evolution of ABA

UTILIZING NEUROPOSITIVITY & POSITIVE REINFORCEMENT



Since its development in the 1970s, Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) therapy has grown by leaps and bounds in ethics, training, and techniques. Previously promoted as a therapy option to help children on the Autism Spectrum become "indistinguishable" from their peers, modern-day clinicians (called Behavior Analysts or BCBAs) have moved to a therapy approach that celebrates the unique strengths of each child. This approach to therapy, called "Neuropositivity", highlights the need for diversity and the development of positive self-esteem.

With this shift has come the transition into positive reinforcement, rewards, and encouragement to reach developmental goals, as well as a more comprehensive approach to care. Modern BCBAs collaborate with a child's extended care team, including their school, families or caregivers, speech therapists, feeding therapists, occupational therapists, and more. This technique can improve communication and teach adaptive life skills to help children be successful in many different settings.

Today, ABA is considered the "gold-standard" therapy option for children on the Autism Spectrum. Part of the reason for its success and evolution, is the high standards of care set by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB) which governs and certifies all clinicians (Behavior Analysts and Behavior Technicians) providing ABA therapy. Every BCBA (Board Certified Behavior Analyst) and RBT (Registered Behavior Technician) is thoroughly trained and held to a strict moral code ensuring quality and ethical treatment practices that encompass dignity, compassion respect, and integrity for individuals and families of every kind.

ABA therapy has continued to evolve in ethical principles, to utilize the least intrusive methods that encourage individual independence and provide a comprehensive treatment approach. Governed by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB), all BCBA's and RBT's are thoroughly trained with a moral code to ensure quality and ethical treatment practices.

EARLY INTERVENTION THERAPY

WHAT IS IT AND WHY DOES IT MATTER?



At its most basic, early intervention services are therapy services that occur before children reach school age and target learning during the most important developmental period of a child's life (birth to age three). Early intervention can take many forms and may include everything from ABA therapy, which helps to address behavioral challenges and build communication/ pre-academic skills, to occupational therapy, which can help with skills like walking, writing, or hand-eye coordination (like throwing or catching a ball).

Many children with developmental delays and/or behavior concerns are not identified early enough. This can lead to significant delays and missed opportunities. Early intervention is crucial to making a difference in the development of children of the Autism Spectrum.

Early intervention programs target basic skills that children typically learn within the first two years of life, like physical skills, communication skills, social skills, and emotional skills. It can also include services like family training, which helps caregivers understand their behaviors, and how to teach skills outside of the therapy center.

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) says that children under the age of three years old who may be at risk of having developmental delays, may be eligible for services provided through early intervention systems in the child's area. Additionally, treatment for specific symptoms often does not need to wait for a formal ASD diagnosis. For example, a child with language delays could start receiving speech therapy before their formal diagnosis, with early intervention services. This is often dependent on a family's insurance coverage. Families should review their benefits prior to starting services.

Early intervention services can help children from birth to three years old learn important skills and greatly improve a child's development and result in better success rates for the individual throughout their life.

Early Intervention Programs Can Include:

- Family Training
- Speech Therapy
- Hearing Impairment Services
- Nutritional Services
- Physical Therapy and/ or Skills
- Communication Skills
- Social Skills
- Emotional Skills
